

Kratos Awarded Navy Training Development Contracts Valued at Approximately \$1.3 Million

Additionally, under the terms of the SWOS agreement, Kratos will provide government site staff augmentation in the areas of Job Duty Task Analysis (JDTA), Front End Analysis (FEA), Business Case Analysis (BCA) and Instructional Systems Design (ISD).
